

Fishing Nut – This is a 3 ½ pound can of Salted Mixed Nuts from the Southern Roasted Nuts Company. The paper label features a Mr. Peanut like character in denim overalls sitting by a stream with a fishing pole in hand.

NBA nut - Caricature of NBA player Ron Harper as "Mr. Peanut Head".

Cap – Baseball cap for the Virginia Diner in Wakefield, VA, the "Peanut Capital of the World". The logo features another animated peanut figure in overalls.


Mug – From the "Peanut Capital of the World", Dothan Alabama. Wait, I thought Wakefield VA was the peanut capital of the world ... I'm so confused!! A 2 for 1 wannabe, comes complete with plush peanut man figure inside the mug.

Brass charm – Image of a smiling peanut in a top hat, the hat comes off to reveal a hollow body. It has a jump

#### **Real Items**

- 1) Box # 1 Plain brown cardboard box. What makes this somewhat unusual is that in addition to once containing product, this box also had a product "display stand" inside- one of the short sides has a white paper label with red lettering for "One Display Stand" for the five cent cellophane mixed nuts bags. 1940's/50's.
- 2) Box # 2 Smaller corrugated cardboard box, with two green Mr. Peanuts stamped on one side and "Seasons Greetings" on the other, with a third panel stating the box's manufacturer. 11" x 4" x 3 ½". The size would indicate that they were meant to hold three metal cans of nuts, and were probably from the Peanut Stores and used to ship as gift packs.
- 3) Bag 1920's glassine bag with a squat looking Mr. Peanut. 10 cent bag for 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounces. Canadian in origin, based on the Toronto location listed on the bag. A variation of this bag's graphics has also been seen entirely in French.
- 4) Sword Yellow foam sword. One side shows Mr. Peanut on the hilt and "Planters" on the blade, the other is an advertisement for the Atlanta Knights, a minor league hockey club. This was presumably a game day give-away. The Knights were only in existence from 1992-1996, before moving to Quebec.
- 5) Ad Full page ad from a 1982 Belgian magazine. The ad copy is in French but the words on the bag are a mixture of French and Dutch, both languages which are spoken in Belgium. This ad is for a spicy dry roasted peanut.
- 6) Calculator –This is a hinged padded book that when opened has a notepad and pen on the right, while on the left is a calculator.  $5 \frac{3}{4}$  x  $4 \frac{1}{2}$  x 1". 1990's?
- 7) Frisbee Yellow plastic Frisbee with Planters Lifesavers graphics. Red edging is somewhat weighted for flight. 7 ½" diameter. 1990's.
- 8) Sweater White acrylic pullover, with the entire right side comprised of a knitted Mr. Peanut logo (left photo). The rear of the shirt cleverly shows Mr. Peanut from behind (right photo). Label says Winter Street Knits. 1990's. This is presumably the companion piece to the scarf shown in Spontak's yellow book page 77, lower left, as the caption in her book states there is a "matching sweater" that goes with the scarf.


2) Christmas sweater #2.

1) Sign – Tin 12" x 9" sign with Novola Oil copy on the front.




